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Training TOP 125 2009

Despite a difficult economy, the 2009 Top 125 companies continued to invest time, dedication, commitment, and resources in learning and development excellence—and had the business results to show for it, particularly PricewaterhouseCoopers, which repeats its No. 1 position on the list. Some 28 newcomers (two in the Top 50) cracked the list this year, the ninth in a row *Training* has ranked the top companies of employer-sponsored workforce training and development. As usual, each Top 125 company was measured on quantitative (75 percent to total score) and qualitative (25 percent to total score) data. Factors influencing the rankings include: Training tied to business objectives • Number of trainers • Employee turnover and retention • Leadership development • Tuition assistance • Corporate university • Certification • Training budget and percentage of payroll. And, much, much more. An outside research and statistical data company, under the guidance of *Training* magazine, scored companies on this data supplied by applicants. Then, our editors subjectively reviewed each application.
